### **Nail your colours to the mast!**

Meaning: To display one's opinions and beliefs. Also used to mean to show one's intentions to hold on to those beliefs until the end.

Origin: In nautical battles colours (flags) were lowered as a mark of submission. Nailing your colours to the mast meant you weren't intending to submit. It is correct to use the English spelling, rather than the US, as the phrase originated in England. As written in 1845 by Sir Nicolas: "Half past 6, shot away the main and mizzen-masts: saw a man nail the French ensign to the stump of the mizen-mast."
